




## PROUD TO BE AN INDIAN


In short, at 75, we can say that India is emerging as an important player on the world stage and continues on its developmental journey with greater confidence, competence and commitment.

# INDEPENDENT INDIA Freedom in our mind, Freedom in our words Pride in our souls, And salute to our nations.



I miss those days where teachers used to scold us at our mistakes. I miss those days where we used to see whether teacher is coming in the class. I miss the prayer we used to do before the exam.






